Some important considerations in following this degree program are:

- ❖ You must be fully admitted to the Music Program to begin this degree program. Please contact the School of Music Office if you are unsure about your status vis-a-vis the Music Program.
- ❖ In order to complete requirements on this degree you will need to be accepted for Music Candidacy at the appropriate time. Admission to Music Candidacy will be granted upon successful completion of the 300-level performance jury and the coursework marked within with an “\*”. Applications for Music Candidacy are available in the School of Music Office.
- ❖ This guide only outlines your music degree requirements. In addition, you must complete requirements for the Bachelor of Arts/Bachelor of Science degree program. These requirements include Area Requirements that can be partially satisfied with required music courses and University Program courses. Please see the requirements listed under the Bachelor of Arts/Bachelor of Science degree in the CMU Bulletin.
- ❖ In order to graduate with this or any other CMU degree, you must successfully complete the University Program and Competency requirements detailed in the CMU Bulletin. If you have questions about these requirements, you should refer your questions to the advisors in the Undergraduate Academic Services (#3504). In completing your UP and Competency requirements, please keep in mind that you will need 40 hours of coursework numbered 300 or above in order to graduate.
- ❖ Music majors and minors on all degree programs must receive a grade of “C” or better in each required MUS course.
