

Course of Study

Bachelor of Music Education - Choral Option

This assembled information is intended to clarify the course requirements and sequence of courses for completion of this degree. Some degree of flexibility in scheduling is possible, however, if you elect to schedule courses without references to the suggestions made in the accompanying outline, be aware that courses are offered only in the semesters as stated in the course description at the back of the CMU Bulletin. We cannot guarantee that schedule conflicts will not prevent you from taking courses you intend to take. You should make every effort to comply with the attached schedule.

The accompanying schedule has been designed to facilitate completion of this degree in five years. It is possible that, by taking additional UP courses in some semesters, carrying higher course loads than those suggested within, or taking some non-music courses during the summers, a student could finish this degree in four and one-half years. Provision for this acceleration of the course sequence is made within. **The course map is advisory and subject to change. The CMU Bulletin is the authoritative source of information.**

Some important considerations in following this degree program are:

- ❖ You must be fully or tentatively admitted to the Music Program to begin this degree program. Please contact the School of Music Office or your private instructor if you are unsure about your status vis-a-vis the Music Program.
- ❖ In order to complete requirements on this degree you will need to be accepted for Music Candidacy at the appropriate time. Admission to Music Candidacy will be granted upon successful completion of the 300-level performance jury and the coursework marked within with an “*”. Applications for Music Candidacy are available in the School of Music Office.
- ❖ In addition to your music requirements, you must complete requirements for Admission to Teacher Education in order to graduate with this degree and be subsequently certified to student teach. Suggestions concerning completion of requirements for Teacher Education are included within. We have suggested that you purchase the Teacher Education Student Handbook immediately upon arrival on campus and familiarize yourself with its contents. The handbook will also be available online at www.ehs.cmich.edu/css.
- ❖ In order to graduate with this or any other CMU degree, you must successfully complete the University Program and Competency requirements detailed in the CMU Bulletin. If you have questions about these requirements, you should refer your questions to the advisors in the Undergraduate Academic Services (#3504). In completing your UP and Competency requirements, please keep in mind that you will need 40 hours of coursework numbered 300 or above in order to graduate.
- ❖ Music majors and minors on all degree programs must receive a grade of “C” or better in each required MUS course. In addition, students on this degree are required by the School of Education to have a grade of “C+” or better in the following music methods courses if the course is taken as a part of the student’s degree: MUS 144, 146, 230, 244, 246, 280, 331, 333, 344, 381, 382, 435, 531, 533, 534.

First Year of Study

Fall Semester: During the first semester, you should schedule an appointment to sign your major and minor with MaryBeth Minnis, Assistant Director of the School of Music. **Teacher Education Requirements:** During your first two years of study, you should complete EDU 107, ENG 101 and the oral and mathematics competencies.

Spring Semester: At the end of the semester, you will perform your 200 level voice jury which will grant you access to 200-level voice study for the second year of study. Discuss specific requirements for this jury with your applied instructor. **Teacher Education Requirements:** After completing EDU 107 (with a grade of B or better) you may wish to submit your application with the application fee receipt and copies of your transcripts to the Center for Student Success in Ronan 204. This will begin the application process enabling you to check your file online at ehs.cmich.edu/css.
